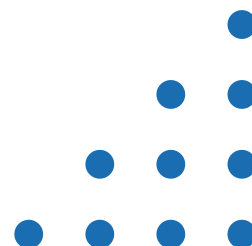


House Resolution 69 and Label of “Hinduphobia”

An Analysis of HAF, CoHNA, and HinduPACT

The Indian American Muslim Council (IAMC) is a Washington, D.C.-based advocacy organization with chapters across the United States. A 501(c)(3) tax-exempt non-profit established in 2002, IAMC is the largest advocacy and human rights organization representing the Indian Muslim diaspora.

The core mission of the Indian American Muslim Council is as follows:

- To defend the fundamental and civil rights of all;
- To preserve the pluralistic and democratic ethos enshrined in the constitutions of the United States and the Republic of India;
- To facilitate increased interfaith and inter-community understanding in the United States, with the goal of safeguarding American society and institutions from hateful ideologies responsible for violence in India;
- To increase awareness about India in order to improve cultural and trade relations between the United States and the Republic of India.

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Introduction

On January 24, 2025, Representative Shri Thanedar (D-MI 13) introduced House Resolution 69¹ titled “Celebrating Hindu Americans, condemning attacks on Hindu places of worship, Hinduphobia, and anti-Hindu bigotry.” It is a near-verbatim reintroduction of his 2024 measure, H.Res.1131, and by June 2026 it carried 32 bipartisan cosponsors, among them Rep. Ro Khanna. House resolutions are nonbinding: they express the sense of the chamber and create no law. What H.Res.69 would do, for the first time at the federal level, is lend congressional weight to a controversial and weaponized term “Hinduphobia”.

Importantly it is being advanced at a moment when hate aimed at South Asians, and at Indians in particular, is rising sharply. The Institute for Strategic Dialogue recorded a 1,350% surge² in anti-South-Asian slurs on X between 2023 and 2024.

Data from the Stop AAPI Hate shows that anti-South Asian hate surges³ in direct response to the political ascendance of prominent South Asian public figures including Zohran Mamdani and Kamala Harris. When tracking extremist spaces, threats of violence and online slurs peaked heavily in late 2024 and mid-2025.

But that hostility is not sorted by religion. It falls on Indians of every background⁴ that includes Hindu, Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Dalit and anyone merely perceived as Indian.

The case for scrutiny rests on who is driving the term. The grassroots push behind H.Res.69 is led by three organizations whose published output this data brief analyzes: the Hindu American Foundation (HAF), the Coalition of Hindus of North America (CoHNA), and HinduPACT. By its own description, HinduPACT is an initiative of the World Hindu Council of America (VHPA). The VHPA is in turn the U.S. affiliate of India’s Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP), a Sangh Parivar body that the CIA’s World Factbook has listed as a “militant religious organization”⁵ and that Human Rights Watch and Amnesty International have linked to anti-Christian and anti-Muslim violence in India.⁶

Because H.Res.69 does not define the term “Hinduphobia,” the public meaning of the term is being shaped largely by the organizations promoting the resolution.⁷ This data brief examines how those organizations themselves use the term.

We examined 242 articles, webpages, and event posts drawn from the three organizations’ own “Hinduphobia” search results. Of these, 87 (36 percent) contained a specific accusation of “Hinduphobia.” These accusations were directed overwhelmingly at critics of Hindu nationalism, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his government, India’s treatment of religious minorities, academics, and advocates for caste discrimination protections. These 87 articles form the analytic sample: 22 from HAF, 43 from CoHNA, and 22 from HinduPACT. Each article was coded for the specific party it accuses and assigned a normalized “collective target” label that groups many phrasings into consistent buckets. A second variable records the framing: whether the cited offense is direct anti-Hindu bigotry, or criticism of Hindutva, caste, or the Indian government of Prime Minister Narendra Modi recast as Hinduphobia.

The remaining 64% of the 242 items consist largely of persecution-abroad reports, temple-attacks coverage, and routine legislative proclamations and resolutions. These articles and pages name no critic and are therefore set aside by the accusation-focused analysis that follows. One pertinent thing observed in the whole corpus is that these organizations rarely name what civil-rights groups identify as the principal drivers of anti-Indian and anti-Hindu hostility in the US: white supremacy and Christian nationalism.

Key Findings

- Of the 242 articles, webpages, and event posts reviewed from HAF, CoHNA, and HinduPACT, only 87 contained a specific accusation of “Hinduphobia.” These 87 articles formed the basis of this analysis. The term is used most often in response to criticism of Hindutva, caste discrimination, the Modi government, and India’s human rights record.
- Campaigns for caste discrimination protections are the single largest category labeled as “Hinduphobia.”
- Academics, universities, journalists, civil rights organizations, and elected officials who criticized Hindutva or persecution of religious minorities in India are among the most frequent targets of “Hinduphobia” accusations.
- Several Hindu-led and South Asian organizations that criticize Hindu nationalism are themselves accused of promoting “Hinduphobia.”
- White supremacist and Christian nationalist groups, widely recognized as major sources of anti-Hindu hate in the United States, are largely absent from the organizations’ “Hinduphobia” campaigns and articles.

Hinduphobia Weaponized Against Critics of Hindu Nationalism

The 87 articles that make specific accusations reveal a clear pattern. Most do not focus on people responsible for anti-Hindu hate crimes or violence. Instead, they accuse people and organizations that criticize Hindutva, campaign against caste discrimination, document human rights abuses, or question the policies of the Modi government.

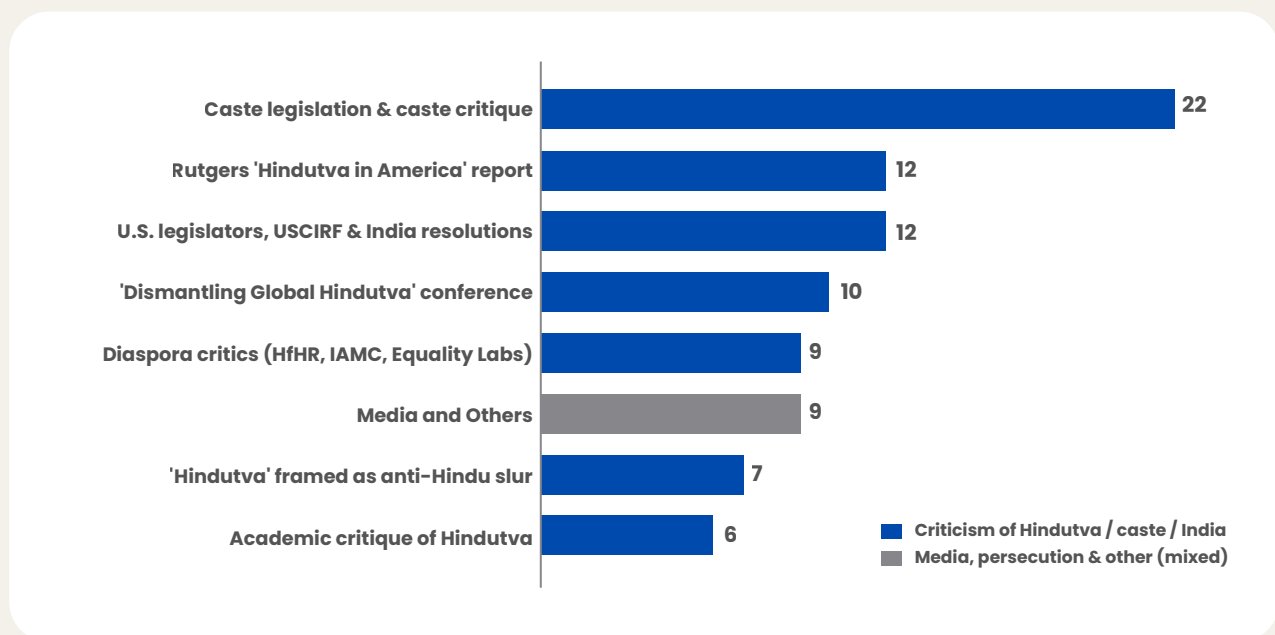


Figure 1. Breakdown of Articles by Hinduphobia Accusation Targets

The largest category is caste discrimination. The Seattle caste ordinance, California's SB 403,⁸ the University of California's caste protections,⁹ and the Cisco caste discrimination¹⁰ case appear more often than any other issue. Across these articles, efforts to recognize caste discrimination are repeatedly presented as examples of "Hinduphobia." Equality Labs, Dalit activists, and academics who study caste are regularly accused of Hinduphobia,¹¹ simply for advocating caste equality or researching caste discrimination.

Universities are another major focus. The Rutgers report Hindutva in America,¹² the Dismantling Global Hindutva conference,¹³ and academic work on Hindu nationalism are all described as examples of Hinduphobia. Rather than engaging with the arguments made by these scholars, the articles frequently argue that criticism of Hindutva itself is discriminatory. HinduPACT has gone a step further through its American Hindus Against Defamation (AHAD) project,¹⁴ which developed an AI tool that labels statements such as describing the RSS as a Hindu nationalist organization as examples of anti-Hindu bias.

Government institutions also appear frequently. Members of Congress, the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF),¹⁵ and city councils that passed resolutions¹⁶ expressing concern about religious freedom in India are all accused of promoting Hinduphobia. Criticism of the Citizenship Amendment Act, concerns over attacks on religious minorities, and reports documenting democratic backsliding in India are often presented as attacks on Hindus rather than criticism of Indian government policies.

Civil society groups are another common target. Organizations such as Hindus for Human Rights, the Indian American Muslim Council, Equality Labs, Savera, and the South Asian Women's Community Centre are repeatedly accused of Hinduphobia. Many of these organizations are led by South Asians, and many are Hindu-led. This shows that the accusation is frequently directed at people within the South Asian community who disagree with Hindu nationalist politics rather than at individuals expressing hatred toward Hindus.

The pattern is consistent across all three organizations examined in this data brief. The term "Hinduphobia" is most often used in response to criticism of caste discrimination, Hindu nationalism, the Modi government, and India's human rights record. The people most frequently accused are academics, journalists, Dalit activists, human rights advocates, elected officials, and civil society organizations, not perpetrators of anti-Hindu violence or religious hate.

Conclusion

There is no question that anti-Hindu prejudice exists and that attacks on Hindu individuals and places of worship should be condemned. Like every religious community, Hindus deserve equal protection from discrimination and hate crimes.

The evidence in this data brief raises a different concern. It shows that the organizations leading the campaign for federal recognition of the term “Hinduphobia” use it in a way that goes far beyond anti-Hindu bigotry. In the articles examined on their respective websites, the accusation is directed most often at people who criticize Hindutva, support caste protections, document human rights abuses, or question the policies of the Modi led Indian government.

This matters because H.Res. 69 would give congressional recognition to a term that has no accepted legal definition. If the organizations promoting the resolution are also defining its meaning in public debate, their interpretation is likely to shape how the term is understood by lawmakers, state legislatures, universities, schools, and public institutions.

The findings suggest that the term could increasingly be used to challenge academic research, oppose caste discrimination protections, and discredit advocacy on religious freedom and human rights. Criticism of a Hindutva ideology, criticism of Modi government’s anti minority policies, and advocacy for civil rights could all be recast as religious discrimination.

The data brief also highlights another important gap. While anti-Hindu hate in the United States is largely driven by white supremacist and Christian nationalist movements, these actors rarely appear in the organizations’ own Hinduphobia articles. Instead, the accusations are directed overwhelmingly at South Asian academics, Dalit activists, journalists, human rights organizations, and other civil society groups.

Members of Congress should be careful not to endorse a term whose leading advocates use it primarily to police criticism of Hindu nationalism rather than to identify genuine anti-Hindu hatred. Protecting Hindus from discrimination is an important goal. That protection should strengthen civil rights for everyone and should not come at the expense of free speech, academic freedom, or advocacy for caste equality and human rights.
